

MEMO To File:

RD 2095 Prop 218 Election

At the request of RD 2095, I acted as the ballot counter for their Prop 218 Election/Vote at their May 17, 2022 Board meeting, scheduled for 10:00 am at the San Joaquin River Club. I arrived a couple of minutes late and soon thereafter they called the meeting to order and opened the public comments for the Election. There were no other members of the public present except me. At the advice of their counsel, they waited 10 minutes to make sure anyone who wished to arrive and comment had ample opportunity to do so.

After addressing some other Agenda issues, they returned to the Prop 218 Election. No other members of the public had arrived.

I collected the sealed ballots that had arrived on time. I opened each one in turn, recording the ballot number, whether it was a "yes" or a "no" and the amount of the votes per each ballot. There were 14 ballots. Each of which was counted. Only one ballot voted "no" with its total votes being 1,820.24. The remainder of the ballots were all "yes" votes totaling 69,757.35, meaning the Prop 218 measure passed.

My totals were checked by staff and we agreed upon these numbers after I had mistakenly counted a "yes" ballot as having 44.80 instead of 64.80, the latter being the correct number on the ballot. Though corrected, I note my initial total having the 20 vote mistake was irrelevant to the measure passing.

I signed and dated the last page of my handwritten ballot count, which is attached hereto.
